### MOT Program-related Expenses

Updated July 2023

We have provided *estimates of MOT program-related expenses* which students may incur during the 2.25 years. For accurate UW tuition/fees information and related questions, please refer to the UW Student Fiscal Services website: <https://finance.uw.edu/sfs/tuition>. We are a publicly funded program with tuition determined by state residency. Out-of-state residents pay a higher tuition rate because WA State tax dollars go towards reducing the in-state resident tuition.

#### Miscellaneous Fees include

Health Sciences Immunizations Program (HSIP)	\$72 per year, charged in quarterly increments
Clinical Placements Northwest (CPNW) account	\$75 annual fee
CastleBranch account for HSIP	\$43 one-time fee
CastleBranch Criminal Background Checks	\$88.99 initial check, \$25.99 for each recheck
BLS/CPR for Healthcare Providers certification	\$60 – 85 for two-year certification

#### Other Expenses

- Clinical sites may require additional criminal background checks, immunizations, or establishing an onboarding account with a third party vendor. Expenses may vary per individual site requirements.
  - Individual immunization costs depend upon health insurance rates and clinic rates.
  - Attire – Sites may require students wear uniforms or scrubs or their own clothing while adhering to dress code guidelines.
  - Travel and commute – Some placements may be located outside of the general area and require longer commutes or temporary living arrangements.
- Computer/laptop – required, costs vary
  - A computer or laptop is required to successfully access programs and online instructional materials used in REHAB courses. Computers need to be able to access high speed internet to, for example, run videoconferencing software, stream video, access Canvas-the UW learning management system, OneDrive and other web-based resources or required learning activities.
- Printing and scanning services – vary by location
- Ordering official UW transcripts - \$11 per each electronic copy
- American Occupational Therapy Association (AOTA) Student Membership - recommended, \$75 per year
- NBCOT exam application and score report - \$555 by paper, \$515 online

#### Living in Seattle

UW MOT students typically live in a variety of housing situations throughout the greater Seattle area. These include UW graduate student housing, individual or shared apartments, and shared houses. The UW recommends students not drive to campus regularly since parking is difficult to find and expensive. In selecting housing, consider other transportation options such as bus, light rail, walking, and/or riding a bike.
